The Food Recovery Act will save money and help address hunger in our communities

Reducing food waste brings financial and health benefits to our families and communities

Too much food is being wasted in Maine, putting a burden on local landfills, adding to disposal costs, harming our air quality, and leaving too many children without enough to eat everyday

- About 28% of what's in our garbage bags is wasted food much of it still edible - costing municipalities and businesses hundreds of thousands of dollars in disposal fees.
- 97% of wasted food goes to landfills where it takes up valuable space and produces methane gas, which is 20 times more powerful in changing our climate than CO₂.
- Maine ranks 1st in New England in food insecurity. One of every four Maine children does not get enough to eat on a regular basis.
- Maine farmers, restaurants, grocery stores, and large facilities like schools and hospitals want to help. But Maine policies do not encourage or adequately protect them if they do.





The Maine Food Recovery Act will help Maine farmers, taxpayers, cities, and towns save money while addressing food insecurity and boosting innovative small businesses. It will:

- Strengthen liability protections for donors of food, and add protections for businesses that sell directly to the consumer at a discount.
- Provide a tax credit to Maine farmers who donate food that would otherwise be wasted.
- Create a stakeholder group of state agency personnel and outside parties to develop strategies and guidance to help large institutions like K-12 schools set-up food recovery programs that save money.
