

Invest in the Clean Water & Safe Communities Bond

Water is Maine's most essential resource. Yet we only seem to notice it when there is too much or too little-or if it's dirty. We must manage our state's water resources to protect clean drinking water sources, help communities safeguard themselves against extreme storms and flooding, and restore our fisheries.

Maine needs new approaches to securing, restoring and maintaining water resources

- The Clean Water and Safe Communities Act is a proposed \$50 million bond to allow investment in natural and built infrastructure that provides water-related benefits for communities across Maine. Funds will be split 50/50 between investments in:
 - Natural Infrastructure, including the conservation or restoration of drinking water aquifers, headwater forests, freshwater and coastal wetlands, lakes and ponds, rivers, streams and their floodplains, clam flats, and eelgrass beds;
 - Built Infrastructure, including stream crossing (culvert) upgrades, small (non-hydro) dam removals, LID stormwater management projects, and irrigation system enhancements.



Maine's water resources are critical assets that support our economy and quality of life; Timely, rationally planned and cost-effective investments in these assets will help Maine



- Ensure an abundant and high quality drinking water supply statewide;
- Allow communities to more effectively prepare for extreme storms and flood events;
- Conserve habitat for recreational fisheries, waterfowl and other important fish and wildlife species;
- Strengthen Maine's long-term economic base and competitive advantage;
- Create and preserve jobs in engineering; and
- Save money in the long-term by mitigating future infrastructure needs.

The Legislature should pass Representative Jeff McCabe's bill:

An Act To Authorize a General Fund Bond Issue To Ensure Clean Water and Safe Communities
